General Rule: A Legal Entity

- ✓ Type of entity
- ✓ Geographical location
- ✓ In some cases, financial viability

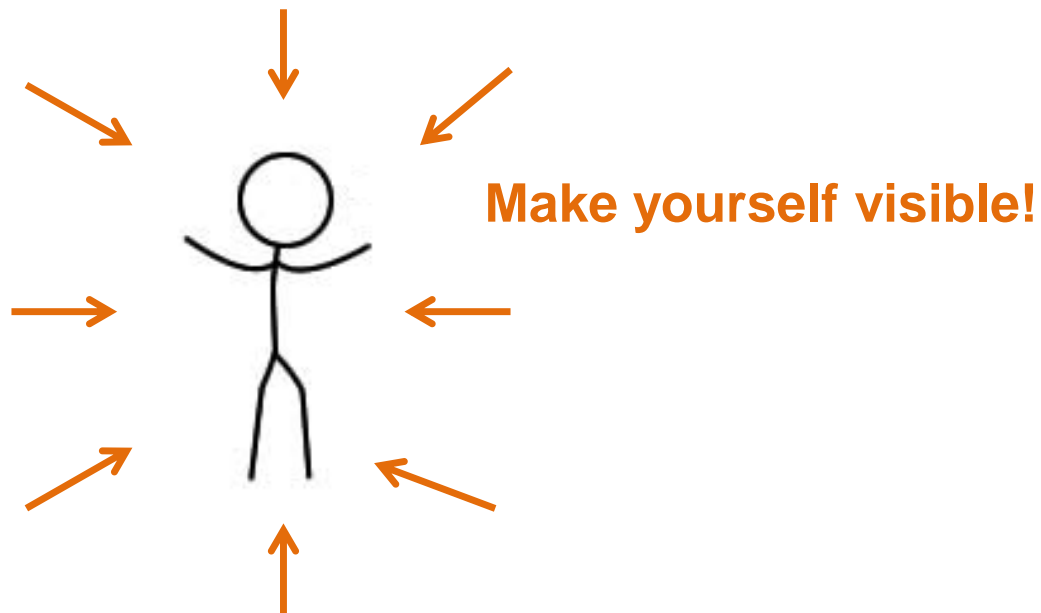

A	Call for action grants: Co-financing of transnational and national projects	EUR 15.210.000
B	Call for operating grants to non-governmental organisations	EUR 1.000.000
C	Grants to bodies identified in the basic act	EUR 6.660.000
II.	Procurement	EUR 4.640.000
	Total:	EUR 27.510.000



Projects should address the following **priorities**:

- ✓ Actions facilitating the provision of **information** to victims on their rights, on the services that are available to them and on the progress of the case. **(VICTIMS-RIGHTS)**
- ✓ Actions improving or establishing the provision of **support**. **(VICTIMS-SUPPORT)**
- ✓ Actions developing individual assessments or mechanisms to help **identify victims with specific protection needs** due to their vulnerability to secondary or repeat victimisation or to intimidation. **(VICTIMS-PROTECTION)**
- ✓ Actions to improve the **protection** of victims when involved in criminal proceedings. **(VICTIMS-PROTECTION)**
- ✓ Actions improving the use and conditions for different forms of **protection measures** through civil, criminal or administrative law measures. **(VICTIMS-PROTECTION)**
- ✓ Actions improving the access of victims to compensation from the State and/or of the offender. **(VICTIMS-COMPENSATION)**

Programme Information and Activity Management Operational System

PRIAMOS is the DG JUSTICE system for operationally managing direct grants. It includes a component which is open for applicants, where they can register, download application forms and submit an application for a grant.

Electronic submission of applications for direct grants via PRIAMOS is a two-step procedure:

- 1st step:** File a registration request for a login and a password. DG JUSTICE will process the request and supply a UserID and an initial password. The login is not specific to the call and can be reused for different applications for grants.
- 2nd step:** With login and password, the applicant can log on to the PRIAMOS system. The applicant can carry out all actions necessary for submitting an electronic application within the framework of a specific call.

For information about the application submission, please consult the guide for applicants specific to each call. The guides, as well as annexes and further information, etc., can be found in the documentation regarding each specific call.

In case of contradictory information, the information in the specific guides prevail. Regarding liabilities, please consult the [disclaimers](#) about PRIAMOS.
