What is the project all about?

We want to help children feel understood, safe and comfortable to talk in the criminal justice system.

Criminal justice system are all the services involved in law, crime and punishment working together.

We want to help children affected by a crime and children that police think broke the law.

We will train police, lawyers, judges and other people on how they can help you tell your story and what happened to you. The court needs to hear you, make you feel safe and understand you to make good decisions.
